Lastly, I'd like to remind you to invite your family and friends to any of our lodge meetings or events. We always welcome new faces and would love to meet those close to you.




Fjelldalen Activities



Fjelldalen's Matklubb Recipes



Baked Lutefisk—Like Fjelldalen Makes!

Ingerdiants:

- Enough thawed lutefisk for however many your are feeding
- Salt

Recipe

- Heat oven to 400°
- Place lutefisk—skin side down— in a greased glass bak-



ing dish and salt

- 3. Cover dish with foil and loosely seal
- 4. Bake 20 to 35 minutes—depending on the thickness of the fish Serve with cream sauce, melted butter, mustard, bacon, or any combination.

Almond Star Cookies

Ingredients:

For the Cookies

- 2 sticks unsalted butter, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- ¼ tsp. salt

1 cup whole blanched almonds

2 cups flour

1 tsp. almond extract

Recipe

- 1) Puree 1/2 cup of the whole blanched almonds in food processor and set aside. Coarsely chop the remaining 1/2 cup of almonds and reserve for later.
- 2) In a large mixing bowl, whisk the flour and salt together and set aside.
- 3) Cream the butter with an electric mixer. Add the pureed almonds and sugar. Blend together until well-combined, and remember to scrape down the sides of the bowl occasionally. Add almond extract and mix until well combined. Next, add the flour mixture and beat until just incorporated.
- 4) Prepare a lightly floured surface and pour out the dough, dividing it in half. Shape each half of the dough into a disc and wrap it in plastic wrap. Refrigerate the discs for at least an hour.
- 5) While dough is resting, line cookie sheets with parchment paper.
- 6) After dough has rested, preheat oven to 325°. (Use an in-oven thermometer to make sure that the temperature of your oven is accurate. Most ovens are 10-25° off of the temperature shown.)
- 7) Lightly flour your work surface and roll out one disc of dough until it is about 1/4" thick. Cut out shapes using various star cookie cutters. Sprinkle with the coarsely chopped almonds.
- 8) Place the cut cookies onto cookie sheets lined with parchment paper and bake for 15-20 minutes. Keep an eye on your first sheet of cookies. You will know they are done when the edges start to turn golden brown. You now know how long each batch should take and can set your timer with no guess work.
- 9) Place your cookies on a wire rack to cool. Once your cookies have cooled, dust them with powdered sugar or with sanding sugar if you want more color. Another great option are luster pearl deco dots.

Planning is the key to retirement transition.



2025 Barneløpet

Saturday, February 22nd, 2025 at The YMCA of the Rockies Snow Mountain Ranch

A Cross Country Ski Race for Youth and an Event for The Whole Family! The Sons of Norway's District Six Colorado Lodges invite you to participate in the children's Barneløpet for young people ages 0 - 16. Barneløpet is a noncompetitive ski event for children modeled after similar ski events in Norway. Literally translated, Barneløpet means "children's race." Every skier finishes a winner! Sons of Norway's Barneløpet is a FREE event open to boys and girls of all skill levels. It's an event where the whole family can get involved. Parents, grandparents and other spectators can line up at the finish line to cheer the skiers on with cowbells, and to give out medals and flags. If your little one needs assistance skiing the course, parents can accompany their child on skis. Chariots will be allowed. After the race, skiers and their families are invited to a reception where the Host Lodges will serve a light lunch of Norwegian hot dogs, snacks and beverages.

Cross Country ski rentals, sponsored by the host Lodges, are available to Barnelopet racers at no charge at Snow Mountain Ranch Nordic Center. It is best to call them at 970-887-2152 to set up rentals in advance for pickup. You'll need to tell them your child's height and weight.

Things to Remember:

- As per YMCA regulations, no walking or snowshoeing on groomed trails.
- Participants need to provide their own skis, rent at no charge (sponsored by host Lodges) at the Snow Mountain Ranch Nordic Center, 970-887-2152, or check your local rental establishment.
- Ski rental and trail access provided for free
- Bring sunglasses and sunblock for the children
